When To Call The Vet



• Especially with excessive bleeding, lameness or near a joint.

Colic

• Rolling, biting at sides, yawning, kicking at belly, refusing to eat, general distress.

Lameness

• Sudden, severe lameness, but any lameness will recover better with fast intervention.

Choke

• Coughing, retching, contorting head and neck, food matter at nostrils, colic symptoms.

Foaling

• If foal isn't born within 20 minutes of water breaking.

Not Eating

 If they show no interest in food, even without any other symptoms.

Eyes

• Any sign of injury or infection, running, swelling, cloudiness.

Anytime you are unsure

• Your vet would rather hear from you sooner than later!
