

When To Call The Vet



Wounds

- Especially with excessive bleeding, lameness or near a joint.

Colic

- Rolling, biting at sides, yawning, kicking at belly, refusing to eat, general distress.

Lameness

- Sudden, severe lameness, but any lameness will recover better with fast intervention.

Choke

- Coughing, retching, contorting head and neck, food matter at nostrils, colic symptoms.

Foaling

- If foal isn't born within 20 minutes of water breaking.

Not Eating

- If they show no interest in food, even without any other symptoms.

Eyes

- Any sign of injury or infection, running, swelling, cloudiness.

Anytime you are unsure

- Your vet would rather hear from you sooner than later!
